Subject: Guidelines for Revision of Tariff in Government Youth Hostels

Sir,

You are aware that as a part of reforms in the management of Youth Hostels, the Ministry of Youth Affairs has already decided that the tariff would no longer be centrally determined, and the Youth Hostel Management Committee has been delegated powers to revise the tariff depending on local condition.

2. It has been observed that in spite of this delegation, no further action seems to have been taken for revising the tariff by the local committees. Therefore the following guidelines have been prepared to help the committee in revising the tariff.

3. In view of increased cost of living and other relevant costs of running Youth Hostels, this Ministry has now considered revision of tariffs in Youth Hostels. The revised tariff guidelines are to be effected in a differential manner keeping the differences in locations and types of accommodations as follows:

[A] Type 1 (Dormitory) – Applicable for all locations

[B] Type 2 (Room/Hall) – Hill Area – Dalhousie, Ooty, Mussorie, Nainital, Shillong, Badrinath, Gangtok, Darjelling

Room (Twin Bedded)	Rs.500	During non peak season, a discount of 20% can be offered on the basic tariff. The peak and non peak season in hill areas will be determined by the Hostel Management Committee (HMC).

[C] Type 3 (Room/Hall) – Tourist Location – Jaipur, Mysore, Chennai, Tirupati, Secunderabad, Panaji, Kochi, Thiruvananthapuram, Puducherry, Jodhpur, Puri, Secunderabad, Agra, Ajmer, Port Blair, Khajuraho, Gopalpur – on- Sea, Amritsar

[D] Type 4 (Room/Hall) – Other important destinations – Bhopal, Guwahati, Aurangabad, Patna, Gandhinagar, Madurai, Gurgaon, Vishakhapatnam, Vijayawada, Hassan, Taran Tarn, Pipli(Kurukshetra), Thanjavur, Trichy .

4. The enhanced tariff guidelines may be treated as model guidelines for adoption by the Hostel Management Committee (HMC).

5. Tariff for food, extra linen, washing, hot water, telephone, internet and other facilities will be determined by the concerned Hostel Management committee (HMC).

6. The revised tariff may be notified immediately and confirmation to this effect be kindly sent.
